PA Child facilitates adoptions through the foster care system and is a State Wide Adoption Network (SWAN) Affiliate. When children enter foster care, the main goal is to reunite them with their biological parents. However, for many children currently in the foster care system, this is not possible. Fortunately, in Pennsylvania, foster care and adoption services can be provided with little or no cost to your family. In fact, most adopted children are supported by medical assistance and subsidies, until adulthood or 21 if adopted after 14 years of age. The Family Living Provider may glean the rewards of gaining a life-long companion and the satisfaction of helping another person. Family Living Providers are granted a non-taxable stipend and room and board payments to subsidize household costs and provide for the individual's needs. # Early Intervention

PA Child offers three Early Intervention Services and Special Instruction Services for children age five years and younger. Attachment and **Bonding** – Is an excellent tool for parents involved in the child welfare system to help correct poor parenting practices. Behavior -This special assistance helps caregivers learn how to develop strategies that can help manage children who have challenging behaviors caused by trauma or developmental concerns. Parenting - This teaches an understanding of child development and encourages good family management practices. All of these services can be referred by local agencies, physicians, or therapists as a means to assist families that need intensive or customized work.
